In the College of Health Sciences, I was appointed by the Dean to serve on the College Curriculum Committee. Additionally, I have been entrusted with responsibilities by the Chair of the Department of Recreation and Park Administration, participating in college-wide committees such as Learning Resources, Scholars Day, Continuing Education, and Academic Integrity. I have also been appointed to multiple departmental committees, including Faculty Evaluation, Promotion and Tenure, and Curriculum. My contributions extend beyond appointments, as I was nominated and elected by peers to serve on significant committees like the Provost Search Committee and Faculty Senate. I've also volunteered on numerous committees at the university, college, and departmental levels, exemplifying my dedication to service and enhancing our academic community.

Honored as the recipient of 12 individual awards recognizing excellence in teaching, scholarship, and service, while the department garnered 5 additional honors/awards during this period. My tenure was marked by significant scholarship production, including 28 refereed publications, 169 technical reports/monographs, 202 presentations, 50 sponsored projects with a total funding of \$639,473, 32 podcast episodes, and 15 online blogs. I also made substantial contributions to student success by serving on 3 doctoral dissertation committees (Chairing 1), 7 master's thesis committees (Chairing 2), and 2 honors thesis committees (Chairing 2). Furthermore, I mentored 13 undergraduate and 19 graduate independent studies, fostering a culture of academic and research excellence.

As the instructor of record, I have taught a wide range of undergraduate courses, including Leisure Career Services, Leisure Diversity & Culture, Civic Engagement Experiences, Place and Identity in Appalachia, Supervision of Recreation Personnel, Management of Recreation Services, Planning, Design, & Maintenance of Recreation Facilities, Independent Study, Research Methods, Internship Supervision, and Resort Recreation Management. For graduate-level instruction, I have taught courses such as Outdoor Recreation Interpretation, Park Management, Natural Resource Tourism, Community Tourism, Bourbon & Beer Tourism, Research Methods, Advanced Research Methods, and Outdoor Recreation in America, in addition to guiding independent study opportunities. I've had the privilege of serving as the primary advisor for undergraduate students as they navigated their academic journey. In addition, I provided guidance and mentorship as an advisor for several student clubs, including

Alternative Spring Breaks, Alpha Phi Omega, Recreation Club, and Rho Phi Lambda, supporting their growth and contributions to the campus community.

As the program graduate coordinator, I assumed a pivotal role in guiding and supporting graduate students, strategically revamping the graduate program curriculum, and fostering collaboration with faculty to drive program initiatives. Notably, I spearheaded a comprehensive transformation of the graduate program, including the development of online versions of courses to meet rigorous online course delivery standards, streamlining course progressions for a more seamless educational experience, and pioneering the migration of the entire graduate program to an online platform, ensuring accessibility and flexibility for all students.

I successfully developed and executed two dynamic marketing campaigns, 'Love your major' and 'Where in the world is RPA,' to drive student recruitment efforts for both undergraduate and graduate programs. The first campaign, 'Love your major,' ran from 2012 to 2017, and the subsequent campaign, 'Where in the world is RPA,' was in effect from 2017 to 2019. These strategic initiatives yielded impressive results, as our total enrollment, encompassing both undergraduate and graduate students, surged from 85 to 190 between 2012 and 2017, and continued its upward trajectory, reaching 221 by 2019. These campaigns not only expanded our reach but also fostered a deep appreciation for our programs, effectively doubling our enrollment within a seven-year span.

I was an active contributor to various professional organizations, assuming diverse roles within the academic and recreational communities. As an accreditation team visitor for the Council on Accreditation for Parks, Recreation, Tourism, and Related Professions, I assessed programs seeking external accreditation, ensuring compliance with rigorous standards. My leadership extended to the Society of Outdoor Recreation Professionals, where I served on the board of directors and chaired multiple committees. I also played a pivotal role on the board of directors for the Kentucky State Parks Foundation and acted as an Association Ambassador for the Kentucky Association for Environmental Education, promoting environmental awareness. My contributions to research and knowledge dissemination included my involvement as a conference executive committee member and co-chair for the Southeast Environment and Recreation Research Conference. Additionally, I held the position of listserv communication director for the Academy of Leisure Sciences and reviewed journal articles for numerous peer-reviewed publications. My dedication to professional growth was underscored by my active membership in various higher education and profession-related associations, and I continually enhanced my expertise by attending relevant conferences, workshops, and seminars. Dreaming Creek Brewery - Richmond, Kentucky

As a co-owner of the brewery, I played a pivotal role in developing compelling content, managing branding, overseeing marketing, and coordinating social media efforts, which collectively led to increased taproom visitation, expanded online engagement, and growth in both onsite and distribution sales.

Moreover, I assumed responsibility for financial management, overseeing the budget for two taprooms, statewide distribution, and operations. During my tenure from 2016 to 2020, I successfully elevated our annual budget from \$40,000 to \$200,000, orchestrated the establishment of a second taproom location, boosted our monthly distribution from 6 barrels to 30 barrels, initiated in-house canning operations, and increased the number of in-house events from 1 to 4 per week, with an accompanying increase in food truck visits from 1 to 3 per week.

In addition to these accomplishments, I provided comprehensive training and scheduling for taproom and event employees. This encompassed state-mandated training, education on brewing operations, beer

styles, and tasting, meticulous facility maintenance protocols, financial management, event planning, facilitation, and assessment, as well as creating operational and special events schedules.

Acting as a community liaison, I proactively enhanced the brewery's presence and outreach within the community, advocated for brewery-related issues in relation to city ordinances, and fostered collaborations with local agencies and organizations to host onsite events and support community activities held offsite. My deep commitment to the brewery culminated in its success, even as I made the difficult decision to sell my share of ownership due to a primary job relocation.
