B. Restatement of problem researched, creative work or professional enhancement opportunity

From September 13th to 15th 2017, I attended the Southern Association of Prelaw Advisors/Southwestern Association of Prelaw Advisors Conference which was headquartered in Memphis, Tennessee at the University of Memphis Law School but which also made stops in Oxford, Mississippi at the University of Mississippi Law School and the Bowen Law School located in Little Rock, Arkansas.
