#### LETTER OF NOTIFICATION

### **Program Deletion**

  This request for program deletion is based on fiscal concerns, as the
  program costs far more to maintain that it generates in revenue.
  In the fall of 2024, in the 7 sections of HIM courses, enrollment averaged
  around 7 students per course. In spring of 2025, across the 8 sections of
  HIM courses, the average was less than 7 students. In Spring of 2025,
  according to the Banner CPOS report, only 22 students are listed as
  pursuing the BS-HIM and enrolled in courses. The program employs 2 fulltime faculty members, plus additional costs for overloads or adjuncts to
  fully cover the required program, and has a rigorous and expensive
  accreditation. With the exception of AHS 2013 Medical Terminology, none
  of the courses offered by this program are typically taken by students in
  other majors.

## Teach-out plan:

All current students will be advised and assisted to complete their remaining coursework by summer 2027. Incoming transfer students who have completed sufficient prerequisite coursework to complete the 3000-and 4000-level HIM courses within that time period are still be admitted for fall 2025, but new freshmen and sophomores at ATU will not be able to declare HIM as a major.

HIM students progress as a cohort through 18 different HIM courses, each offered in only one specific semester, with the final courses ending in summer. Many of these courses have not previously been approved for substitutions. Thus, the two-year teach-out period will accommodate students in the junior and senior cohorts during academic year 2025-26, and then all remaining students for the senior cohort during academic year 2026-27.
