## LETTER OF NOTIFICATION

### **Program Deletion**

  This request for program deletion is based on fiscal concerns, as the
  program costs far more to maintain than it generates in revenue. For all
  three HI courses originally placed on the schedule for fall of 2024 (HI 5092,
  HI 6053, HI 6073), only one student registered to take these courses; two of
  the courses ended up canceled; in the course that was allowed to run,
  before the course ended the only student dropped. In Spring of 2025,
  according to the Banner CPOS report, only 6 students are listed as
  pursuing MS-HI and enrolled in courses. The only faculty member qualified
  to teach HI courses resigned in January of 2025, and hiring a replacement
  for this faculty member is not financially feasible or justifiable. There are no
  "HI" courses being offered in spring of 2025, all active students are
  substituting any needed courses from other departments.

#### Teach-out plan:

All current students will be advised and assisted to complete their remaining coursework by May 2026. The MS-HI program consists of 6 HI courses, one of which is cross-listed with NUR 6303, 4 INFT courses (two specified, two electives), and one MATH course. Some HI courses may be taught by adjuncts. Also, because of low enrollment, numerous substitutions have been made in recent semesters and will be allowed for current students as needed.
